1753/54 Memorial

The dedication for the 1753/54 Memorial will be Saturday, June 21, at 11:30 a.m. following the Waldoboro Day parade. The Memorial is in front of the flag at the entrance to the Miller School on Route 32 about one-half mile south of Route 1. Parking is available at the school.

OBB President David Putnam will open the service with a brief talk on the history of the memorial and the significance of its placement. Reverend Michael Murphy will offer a prayer in German. Ruth Riopell and June Hussiere will unveil the memorial.

Waldoboro Day schedule

Queries

Pease / Ludwig / Kaler: Cynthia McCausland is looking for information on Sophronia Pease, daughter of Zebediah and Sarah Pease. Was she the lady from Hope who married John Ludwig of Waldoboro in 1822 per the *Ludwig Genealogy*? Was this the same couple reported by *Broad Bay Pioneers* as married in Waldoboro in 1819? The *Ludwig Genealogy* indicates John died after the birth of his last child in 1830. Was it his widow who married Samuel Kaler in March 1833? Cynthia may be contacted at cynmc2@cox.net.

Orff House: Shelley Rider is interested in locating old photos, stories, and historic information about the old Orff house on Route 1 in Waldoboro which was purchased by her husband's grandfather in the 1920s and which has now passed to her and her husband. Schwartz / Burns / Bornheimer / Lampson / Gross: Donald Lamson is looking for information on Olevia/Olivia Schwartz. She died 12 Feb 1884 in West Camden and was buried in West Rockport with her husband, Otis Ingraham. They married 24 Dec 1831 in Waldoboro (int. 9 Dec). From her death records, she was born about 1814. Olevia was listed as being of Waldoboro when she married. An old genealogy prepared by a relative says she was the daughter of James Schwartz. I'd be very interested in finding more about Olevia's birth and her parents.

Donald is also looking for information on Elsie/Elcia/Elcya Burns. She may have been a Bornheimer. She died 10 Jul 1848, ae. 51 yrs, 6 mos, 28 days in Rockland. She was married to Ambrose Lampson, Sr. on 19 Oct 1817 in Thomaston (or Rockland) (int. 15 Aug 1817 (Thomaston)). Ambrose's adopted grandparents were Jonathan Lampson and Mary Gross, born circa 1753, probably in Broad Bay, daughter of Johan Gross. It is because of the Gross connection that I'm guessing that Elsie may have been a Bornheimer. I'd be interested in determining the date and place of Elsie's birth, as well as the identity of and other information concerning her parents. Donald may be contacted at lamson3@verizon.net.
