GENEEOLOGICAL CONTEXT OF WALDOBORO'S GEORGE MINK-----
by David Grindell, La Crescenta, California

The great emigration of the Münchs from Germany to America- it embraced more families than indicated here- was a chapter in the early settlement of PENNSYLVANIA. John Georg's coming to MAINE was something of an accident.

If in MAINE, Münch has become Mink or Mank; in PENNSYLVANIA, Minnich, etc., has prevailed. (ALSO MUENCH, MING, MINCH, MINCK, MIWNICK, MENNEGH, MENNIG, MINCK, MYNICH.

As seen on this sheet, the predominance of males is striking. Waldoboro's remarkable Valentine Mink is said to have been a 7TH son of a 7TH son.

My ggrandfather **Capt Charles F Hall**, was born in Bangor, 1855. He came to SF in 1880, got married and stayed here. His brothers also came to SF as master mariners until about 1892. They all ran up and down the west coast with the Pacific Steamship Co mostly. In SF directories there is the Hall Bros Shipbuilding. It looks like they had an office in SF and a shipbuilding operation in Port Blakely, WA. It appears they built about 30 ships, possibly more. Their names were **Issac, Henry K, and Winslow Hall**. The Hall Shipbuilding line apparently came from Mass. But because of the 1906 earthquake many records have been destroyed. I'm wondering if the 2 Hall families are related. According to the census, **Winslow** and another brother (**Abraham**) were born in Maine. Winslow was a sea captain in SF as early as 1860. I'm almost certain that Capt Charles brothers' went back to Maine, 1892. His brothers were **Captains Edward, Andrew L and Edwin J Hall**. Edward died here in 1892, and there is nothing else here about them in the directories after that. Capt Charles died here in 1920 after retiring as a tugboat captain in the SF bay area. Oddly, his son **Capt William Alexander Hall**, worked for the Admiral Lines for 33 yrs, was a commander during WWII and retired as a tugboat captain on the Columbia River out of Astoria, Oregon. I've been able to identify many ships they sailed during their careers in hopes of shedding more light about their lives. I'm fairly certain that in 1892 when Edward died that there was still family or friends in Camden, ME, but concrete evidence is slim. Lisa Hall-Judd
